




MEET THE TEAM








STOCKHOLM

Stockholm, the largest city in Scandinavia, effortlessly intertwines a rich history and stunning nature with the cultural sophistication, modern architecture, and dynamic attitudes of a thriving metropolis. This unique blend is enhanced by the omnipresence of water, adding an extra layer of charm. Stockholm was officially founded in 1252 by the Swedish statesman Birger Jarl. By the end of the 13th century, it had grown to become Sweden's biggest city, serving as the country's political centre and royal residence – facing several sieges over the centuries.



VASA MUSEUM

The Vasa is the best-preserved seventeenth-century ship in the world and a unique art treasure. More than 98 percent of the ship is original, and it is decorated with hundreds of carved sculptures. The 69 meter-long warship Vasa sank on its maiden voyage in Stockholm harbor in 1628 and was salvaged 333 years later in 1961. For nearly half a century the ship has been slowly, deliberately, and painstakingly restored to a state approaching its original glory. The three masts on the roof of the tailor-made museum show the height of the ship's original masts. There are different exhibitions around the ship ranging from topics like life on board and its historical context. The film about the Vasa is shown in different languages. There is also an audio guide in different languages, to be used by visitors on their own mobile devices.



ARCHIPELAGO

The Stockholm archipelago, with its 30,000 islands, skerries, and rocks, stretches 80 kilometres east from the city into the Baltic Sea. Recently named one of the world's top destinations for 2025 by National Geographic, the archipelago is easily accessible by boat and offers opportunities for swimming, outdoor activities, and enjoying traditional Swedish cuisine in the fresh sea air. Being such a vast area there's certainly something to discover for everyone; serene nature seemingly untouched by civilization, cozy and accessible camping grounds, idyllic villages and coastal towns, hiking trails for both experienced and amateur outdoorsmen, great food, and fantastic culture. Oh yeah, and water. Lots of water.



COPENHAGEN

Originally a Viking fishing village established in the 10th century in the vicinity of what is now called Gammel Strand, Copenhagen became the capital of Denmark in the early 15th century. In addition, Copenhagen is the 2nd largest city in Scandinavia, extending over an area of 90 km². It is the focal point of the cross-border Øresund Region, the Nordic region's largest metropolitan region.



TIVOLI GARDEN

Tivoli is a playground for young and old and a spot so full of wonder that it inspired Hans Christian Andersen and Walt Disney. Whether you come for the gardens, music or rides, you'll have a blast. Tivoli Gardens was founded in 1843 and has become a national treasure and an international attraction. Fairytale writer Hans Christian Andersen visited many times, as did Walt Disney who even found the inspiration for his own Disney World here. When the garden was founded it was placed outside the city's moats, but today it's located right next to the Central station and within walking distance of City hall. Part of Tivoli Gardens' secret is that there is something for everyone. The scenery is beautiful with exotic architecture, historic buildings, and lush gardens. At night, thousands of coloured lights create a fairytale atmosphere that is completely unique. It has guirks and charm, and details for you to discover you might catch a glimpse of the guinea fowls or peacocks running freely through the gardens.



ROSENBORG CASTLE

Rosenborg Castle was built by one of the most famous Danish kings, Christian IV, in the 17th century. The beautiful castle features 400 years of royal treasures, and the Crown Jewels and Royal Regalia. Walk up the spiral steps and discover rooms filled with royal details and lavish portraits. Among the main attractions is the Knights' Hall with the coronation thrones, decorated with narwhal tusks, with three life-size silver lions standing guard. Tapestries on the walls commemorate battles between Denmark and Sweden. The interiors are well-preserved and invite you to take a journey in time, stepping into the shoes of the royalty that once lived here. You can see the king's private writing cabinet, his bathroom, and view wax figures of former royal inhabitants.

OSLO

As the largest city in Norway and the second-largest municipality in the Nordic region, the country's capital, Oslo, is both modern and diverse. It also has a rich enough past to intrigue aspiring historians. Snowy mountains. Glaciers. Fjords. Forests. Oslo's stunning scenery inspires awe and wonder. The beautiful view of the Nærøydalen valley from Stalheim has for nearly 200 years been one of the highlights of many a traveler's visit to Western Norway. From Stalheim you can go for long walks in the mountains, you can choose short and long hikes, go fishing or visit Stalheim Folk Museum. Stalheim is also a good base for excursions by car or public transport. The hotel has a spectacular location on top of the Stalheimskleiva - overlooking the Nærøydalen valley.
