MORAY

Located in Peru's Sacred Valley, Moray is an extraordinary Inca archaeological site famous for its massive circular terraces built into natural depressions in the landscape. Many archaeologists believe the site served as an agricultural research center, where the Incas experimented with crops under different temperatures and growing conditions created by the terraces' unique microclimates.

Surrounded by the breathtaking Andes Mountains, Moray showcases the remarkable engineering and agricultural knowledge of the Inca civilization. Today, visitors can walk around the terraces, admire the stunning scenery, and discover one of the most innovative sites of the Inca Empire.



MARAS SALT MINES

Located in Peru's Sacred Valley, the Maras Salt Mines are one of the country's most remarkable cultural landmarks. Made up of thousands of salt evaporation ponds built into the mountainside, the site has been used for salt production since pre-Inca times and continues to be operated by local families using traditional methods passed down through generations.

Fed by a naturally salty spring, each pond is carefully managed by hand as the water evaporates, leaving behind mineral-rich salt. Visitors can admire the breathtaking landscape, learn about this centuries-old tradition, and discover how the Maras Salt Mines remain an important part of Peru's cultural heritage.

PISAC

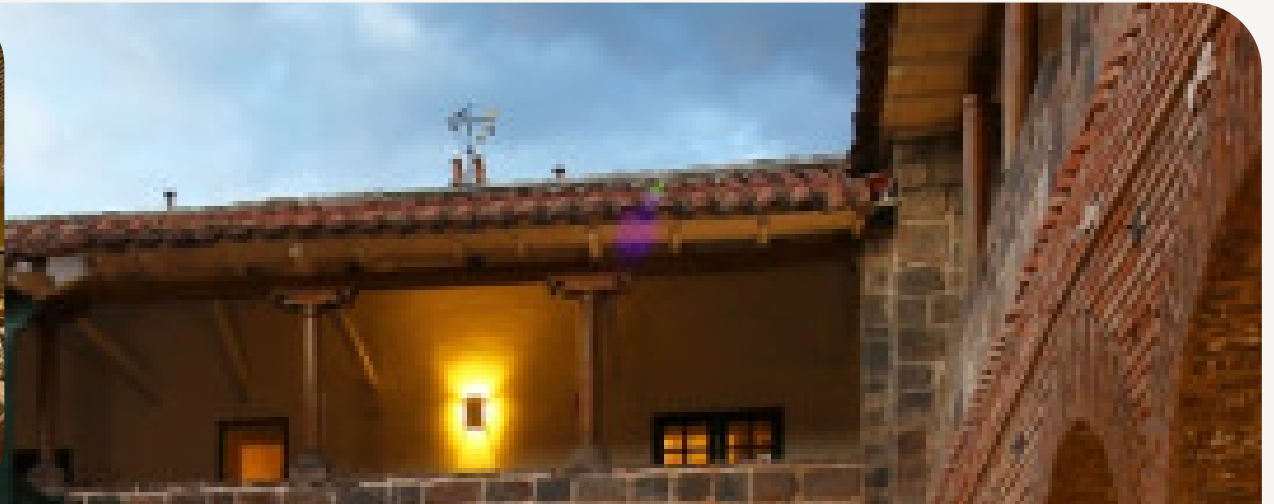

RAINBOW MOUNTAIN

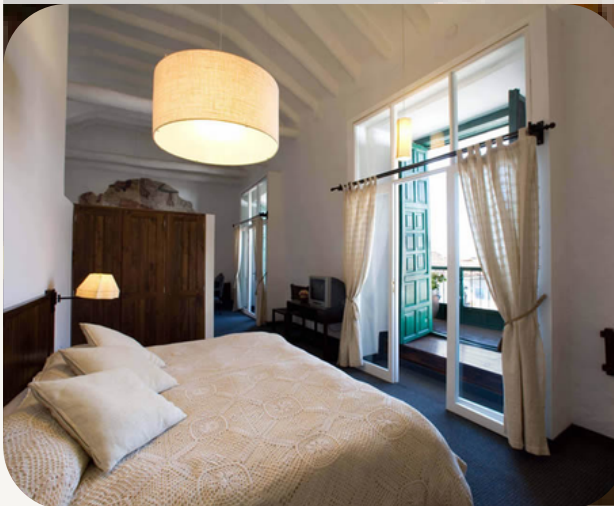
